

Frequently Asked Questions about E-Books

E-Books and electronic versions of our favorite resources are instant and affordable. They are quickly becoming valuable teaching resources. Below you will find answers to some of the most frequently asked “how to” questions regarding electronic downloads in The Schoolhouse Store.

Q. Can I download E-Books with a slow dial-up connection?

A. Yes. Obviously, it will take much longer to download with dial-up than with high-speed, and you may have problems downloading a very large file. Most of our files in The Schoolhouse Store should be easily downloaded by dial-up users.

Q. What do I do if I have problems downloading my E-Book from The Schoolhouse Store?

A. If you have problems downloading an E-Book from The Schoolhouse Store, simply email [Customer Service](#) for assistance.

Q. How do I save the E-Books on my computer so that I can find them again?

A. We recommend setting up a folder just for E-Books. To do so, simply click **start** in your taskbar, click on **my documents** and click on **make a new folder**. You can name the folder whatever you wish. **E-Books** is a simple, easy to remember title. Then, you can move all of your E-Book downloads into this one folder.

When you download an E-Book, you have the option to **open** or **save**. If you choose **open**, the E-Book will pop up in a new window, as an Adobe pdf file. From here, choose **file**, then **save as**, and you can select where you would like the E-Book to be stored. Select **my documents** and then look for the **E-Books** folder that you previously created. Double click on the **E-Books** folder and your E-Book will be saved there for easy reference.

You may also want to consider saving your E-Books to a CD or jump drive. This frees up space on your computer and your E-Books are still stored in one handy location.

Q. Can I print an E-Book?

A. Certainly! You can print the entire E-Book or just the pages that you need. With most, you can even print multiple copies for use within your own family. Just check the book's copyright page for details.

Example: If you have 3 children and there is a workbook page in an E-Book that you want for all 3, you can print out 3 copies of that particular page, whereas a traditional consumable workbook's copyright policy would prevent such use.

Q. Can I email my E-Book to a friend to share it with them?

A. Absolutely not! E-Books are copyrighted just like print books. You can't just email them to others or upload them to a website to share. Both actions are immoral and illegal. If you find an E-Book that you think your friend would enjoy, please send them an email with a link to the site where they may download/purchase it for themselves.
